For over a century, the NCAA has enforced rules and policies that largely prohibited colleges from compensating student-athletes. In a June 2021 narrow ruling that may have broader implications, the

Supreme Court unanimously ruled that the NCAA's rules regarding modest payments tied to educational expenses violated the Sherman Act. We'll discuss the ruling, the implications on other NCAA rules regarding student-athlete compensation, and how this ruling may have broader implications regarding wage rules.
