Furthermore, attendees will learn how to locate and effectively work with construction, architectural, engineering, and financial experts, ensuring their work product is properly integrated into the litigation strategy. By the end of the session, participants will be equipped with the tools and strategies needed to navigate complex document discovery, make informed decisions, and bolster their practice in construction litigation.
